The reservation system is a user pay system. Customers pay a reservation fee of \$10.00 which reflects the cost charged by Camis Inc. That reservation fee is initially collected by the ministry and then paid to Camis Inc. From March 2012 – March 2013 Parks, Culture and Sport paid \$344,467.50 for all online reservations.
