MOTION TO BETTER PROTECT CHILDREN BY COMBATING CYBERBULLYING

That this Assembly supports the efforts of the federal, provincial and territorial justice ministers to better protect children by combating cyberbullying, including but not limited to changes to the *Criminal Code of Canada* that would make it a specific criminal offence to share intimate images without consent.

Ordered, That the Speaker, on behalf of the Legislative Assembly, transmit verbatim transcripts of the motion regarding cyberbullying to the Prime Minister of Canada, the federal opposition leaders, the federal Minister of Justice, and the justice ministers from all the provinces and territories across Canada.
