To the Minister of the Economy: The number of times the Ministry of the Economy has used its discretion and extended the test period for new heavy oil wells, new heavy oil single wells, and multi-well batteries beyond the required lesser of 6 months or until combined flared and vented volumes exceed a rolling average of 900m³/day for any consecutive 3-month period.

Ms. Sproule, for Return No. 627 showing:

To the Minister of the Economy: The economic value of the volume of associated gas that has been conserved due to Directive S-10 from July 1, 2012 to date.

Ms. Sproule, for Return No. 628 showing:

To the Minister of the Economy: The volume of associated gas that has not been conserved due to Directive S-10 from July 1, 2012 to date.

Ms. Sproule, for Return No. 629 showing:

To the Minister of the Economy: The economic value of the volume of associated gas that has not been conserved due to Directive S-10 from July 1, 2012 to date.

Ms. Sproule, for Return No. 630 showing:

To the Minister of the Economy: The number of oil wells and battery sites that have flare volumes greater than 900m³/day per site and are within 500 metres of existing residences where, regardless of economics, they must conserve their associated gas.

Ms. Sproule, for Return No. 631 showing:

To the Minister of the Economy: The number of oil wells and battery sites that have flare volumes greater than 900m³/day per site and are within 500 metres of existing residences where, regardless of economics, are exempted from conserving their associated gas due to consent being obtained from the residence.

Ms. Sproule, for Return No. 632 showing:

To the Minister of the Economy: The number of oil wells and battery sites that have flare volumes greater than 900m³/day per site and are within 500 metres of existing residences where, regardless of economics, are exempted from conserving their associated gas due to the licensee submitting scientific or technical information and the Ministry of the Economy deeming the exemption appropriate.

To the Minister of the Economy: The number of oil wells and battery sites with flare volumes more than 900m³/day that have conducted economic evaluations decide whether associated gas conservation is needed pursuant to Directive S-10.

Ms. Sproule, for Return No. 635 showing:

To the Minister of the Economy: The number of oil wells and battery sites with flare volumes greater than 900m³/day that meet the economic criteria have begun associated gas conservation.

Ms. Sproule, for Return No. 636 showing:

To the Minister of the Economy: The amount of oil wells and battery sites with gas-to-oil ratios of greater than 3500m³/m³ that have been shut in for any period of time due to not having associated gas conservation systems in operation.

Ms. Sproule, for Return No. 637 showing:

To the Minister of the Economy: The amount of oil well and battery sites with flare volumes greater than 900m³/day but not meeting the economic criteria for associated gas conservation that have undergone yearly reviews to verify that conservation is not economically feasible.

Ms. Sproule, for Return No. 638 showing:

To the Minister of the Economy: The amount of oil wells and battery sites with flare volumes greater than 900m³/day but not meeting the economic criteria for associated gas conservation that have had the frequency of their reviews to verify that conservation is not economically feasible reduced to less than once per year by the Ministry of the Economy.

Ms. Sproule, for Return No. 639 showing:

To the Minister of the Economy: The amount of oil wells and battery sites with flare volumes less than 900m³/day that have been required to conduct economic evaluations by the Ministry of the Economy.

Ms. Sproule, for Return No. 640 showing:

To the Minister of the Economy: The amount of licensees with oil wells and battery sites with associated gas conservation that have applied to the Ministry of the Economy to discontinue their associated gas conservation.

Ms. Sproule, for Return No. 641 showing:

To the Minister of the Economy: The amount of licensees that have successfully received approval from the Ministry of the Economy for discontinuance of associated gas conservation on oil wells and battery sites.

Ms. Sproule, for Return No. 642 showing:

To the Minister of the Economy: The amount of oil wells and battery sites with odorous compounds such as mercaptan, volatile organic compounds or ammonia that have had site specific emissions concentration restrictions set on them by the Ministry of the Economy.

To the Minister of the Economy: How the Ministry of the Economy is monitoring oil wells and battery sites to ensure that the venting non-combustible or inert gas mixtures are not resulting in an exceedance of the Saskatchewan ambient air quality standard.

To the Minister of the Economy: The number of times that the Ministry of the Economy field offices were notified of licensees conducting non-routine or temporary flaring, incineration, and venting during upsets and outages of associated gas conservation facilities between December 1, 2007 and June 30, 2012.

Ms. Sproule, for Return No. 652 showing:

To the Minister of the Economy: The number of times the Ministry of the Economy has approved non-routine or temporary flaring, incineration, and venting of associated gas facilities from July 1, 2012 to date.

Ms. Sproule, for Return No. 653 showing:

To the Minister of the Economy: The number of times the Ministry of the Economy has approved non-routine or temporary flaring, incineration and venting of associated gas facilities over the one week (7 days) limit.

SEVENTY-FIVE MINUTE DEBATE

The Order of the Day being called for the following motion for a Seventy-five Minute Debate, it was moved by Mr. Forbes:

That this Assembly expresses grave concerns about the federal government's Bill C-51 because its terms unreasonably infringe upon the freedoms of Saskatchewan people and all Canadians, it lacks appropriate parliamentary oversight, and it undermines the integrity of our democracy.

A debate arising and the period of seventy-five minutes having expired, pursuant to Rule 25(5) the Deputy Speaker interrupted proceedings.

PRIVATE MEMBERS' MOTIONS

The Assembly resumed the adjourned debate on the proposed **Motion No. 1** moved by Ms. Eagles:

That this Assembly supports this government's commitment to the Boundary Dam Integrated Carbon capture and sequestration project. This innovative facility is the first of its kind and is a tangible step in addressing the production of greenhouse gases worldwide. Further its innovative technology supports Saskatchewan's resource industry which is vital to the prosperity of our province.
