STATEMENT BY THE SPEAKER (UNPARLIAMENTARY LANGUAGE)

I am prepared to rule on the point of order that was raised by the Government House Leader immediately after Question Period, on Thursday, October 20, 2016. The Government House Leader (Hon. Mr. Merriman) alleged that the Leader of the Opposition had said that the Premier cannot be trusted.

In response to the point of order, the Opposition House Leader (Mr. McCall) countered that the Leader of the Opposition used language that was within the accepted rules and usage of this Assembly.

I have reviewed Hansard and on page 771 the Leader of the Opposition stated, and I quote, "And we should be able to trust, we should be able to trust what the Premier is saying about the finances".

Members are well aware that it is not permissible to accuse or suggest that another member was not being truthful. This practice is codified in our Rule 51(f), in paragraph 484(3) of *Beauchesne's Parliamentary Rules and Forms*, 6th Edition and on page 618 of *The House of Commons Procedure and Practice*, 2nd Edition, 2009.

In this Assembly, many Speakers have ruled that the integrity of Members should not be questioned and the imputations of intentional falsehoods are not permissible. While it is not unparliamentary to criticize statements made by Members as being contrary to the facts, the integrity or motives of Members whether individually or collectively, should not be questioned directly or indirectly.

After reviewing Hansard, I find that the Leader of the Opposition's comments were not directed specifically at the Premier. Rather, they were directed at the accuracy of the information provided by the Premier relating to the finances of the province. As outlined by Speaker Toth in his ruling of March 29, 2010, and I quote, "Members understanding of the facts often differ and that is why we have debate in this Chamber". For this reason I find the point of order not well taken.

In closing, I want to caution all Members to avoid words and phrases that could be misconstrued as a reflection on another Member's personal character.
