## **READING AND RECEIVING PETITIONS**

Residents of the province of Saskatchewan request that the Legislative Assembly cause the government to protect wetlands by increasing funding to do proper inventory work, putting Saskatchewan in a better position to manage the resource, speed up the evaluation of high risk watersheds where there is a significant damage annually from flooding, and create a sound and transparent mitigation process.

The Ministry of Social Services does not track the frequency or number of client meetings. The Minister of Social Services has engaged with the following stakeholders, who represent individuals experiencing disabilities:

- Saskatchewan Disability Income Support Coalition (DISC)
- Saskatchewan Association for Community Living (SACL)
- Program Implementation Advisory Team (PIAT)
- Saskatchewan Association of Rehabilitation Centres (SARC)
- Regina Anti-Poverty Ministry

- (5) 419 random workplace safety inspections have been conducted in 2016-17 to September 30, 2016.
