#### **SUPPLEMENTARY ESTIMATES NO. 1**

#### **EXECUTIVE BRANCH OF GOVERNMENT**

Resolved, That there be granted to Her Majesty for the twelve months ended March 31, 2021 the following sums:

Moved by the Hon. Ms. Harpauer:

Resolved, That towards making good the supply granted to Her Majesty on account of certain charges and expenses of the public service for the fiscal year ending March 31, 2021, the sum of four hundred eighty-two million dollars be granted out of the general revenue fund.

The said resolution was reported, read twice and agreed to, and the committee given leave to sit again.

#### The Appropriation Act, 2020 (No. 2)

Moved by the Hon. Ms. Harpauer: That Bill No. 25 — The Appropriation Act, 2020 (No. 2) be introduced and read the first time.

The question being put, it was agreed to and the said bill was accordingly read the first time.

Pursuant to rule 32(1)(e), the said bill was then read a second and third time and passed under its title.

#### SECOND READINGS

# Bill No. 1 — The Income Tax (Strong Recovery Home Renovation Tax Credit) Amendment Act, 2020

Moved by the Hon. Ms. Harpauer: That Bill No. 1 - The Income Tax (Strong Recovery Home Renovation Tax Credit) Amendment Act, 2020 be now read a second time.

A debate arising and the question being put it, was agreed to and the said bill was accordingly read a second time and, pursuant to rule 75(1), committed to a Committee of the Whole on Bills.

# Bill No. 2 — The Income Tax (Strong Recovery Small Business Tax Reduction) Amendment Act, 2020

The Hon. Ms. Harpauer, a member of the Executive Council, having acquainted the Assembly that His Honour the Lieutenant Governor, having been informed of the subject matter of the bill, recommends it to the consideration of the Assembly, moved: That Bill No. 2 — The Income Tax (Strong Recovery Small Business Tax Reduction) Amendment Act, 2020 be now read a second time.

The question being put it, was agreed to and the said bill was accordingly read a second time and, pursuant to rule 75(1), committed to a Committee of the Whole on Bills.
