#### STATEMENT BY THE SPEAKER (Unparliamentary Language)

On Saturday, April 10, 2021, the Government House Leader (Hon. Mr. Harrison (Meadow Lake)) raised a point of order asserting that the Opposition House Leader (Ms. Mowat) used an unparliamentary expression by accusing ministers of, and I quote, "making stuff up." I indicated I would review the proceedings. On page 369 of Hansard the Opposition House Leader is cited as saying "We've gotten used to the Health minister making things up on the fly..." This type of expression has been ruled out of order numerous times when used by Members on both sides of the Chamber. I find the point of order well taken and ask the Member to rise, withdraw and apologize.

Thereupon, the Opposition House Leader withdrew her remarks and apologized.
