## QUESTIONS ORDERED FOR RETURN

**The following written questions were converted and orders for return were issued:**

**Return no. 9 (Mr. Love):**

To the Minister for Seniors, for each of the Extendicare facilities in Saskatchewan: (a) the number of staff that contracted COVID-19 as of March 31, 2021, (b) the number of residents that contracted COVID-19 as of March 31, 2021, (c) regardless of the location of the death, the number of residents that contracted COVID-19 that died while being deemed infectious, (d) regardless of the location of the death, the number of residents that contracted COVID-19 that died after being deemed recovered, (e) if required, the period(s) of time for which municipal protective services were on-site to provide pandemic-related support between April 1, 2020 and March 31, 2021, (f) if required, the period(s) of time for which provincial or SHA resources were on-site to provide pandemic-related support between April 1, 2020 and March 31, 2021, and (g) the cost to the government for any municipal, provincial, or SHA resources referenced in (f).
