That the Assembly recognizes that systemic racism exists in Saskatchewan, including within the Government of Saskatchewan, and, further,

That the Assembly calls on the Government to take the necessary action needed to address and end systemic racism in Saskatchewan, including systemic racism within the Government of Saskatchewan.

A debate arising and the period of seventy-five minutes having expired, pursuant to rule 25(5) the Deputy Speaker interrupted proceedings.

PRIVATE MEMBERS' MOTIONS

The order of the day being called for **motion no. 2**, it was moved by Ms. Ross (Prince Albert Northcote):

That this Assembly calls on the federal government to immediately commit to long-term funding increases to the Canada Health Transfer, representing an increase from its current share of 22% to 35%, in order to keep pace with rising health care costs that are putting unsustainable financial pressure on provinces and territories.

A debate arising, it was on motion of Mr. Ottenbreit, adjourned.
