PRAYERS

SESSIONAL ORDER

Moved by the Hon. Mr. Harrison (Meadow Lake), by leave of the Assembly:

That the proceedings of the Legislative Assembly and its committees be subject to modification due to the ongoing and evolving context of the COVID-19 pandemic, as follows:

- 1. Members of the Legislative Assembly are required to be fully vaccinated against COVID-19 or provide proof of a negative COVID-19 test within 72-hours to attend and participate in all forms of legislative proceedings;
- 2. The Speaker is authorized to determine the standards for verification of vaccination and negative COVID-19 testing;
- 3. Members of the Legislative Assembly shall wear a mask at all times in the Chamber and committee room except when speaking during proceedings after being recognized by the chair;
- 4. Employees of the Legislative Assembly, government officials, media, and public observers shall wear a mask at all times in the Chamber and committee room except when required to participate in proceedings;
- 5. Rule 2 shall not be applicable to any member unable to attend a sitting for reasons of self-isolation due to exposure to COVID-19;

6. Proxy voting for recorded divisions, as specified at section 3(d) of the Standing Committee on House Services fifth report of the twenty-ninth legislature and the associated designated proxy form contained in Appendix 6, shall apply to any member unable to attend a sitting for reasons of self-isolation due to exposure to COVID-19; and

That this sessional order shall be enforced by the Speaker and presiding officers for the duration of the fall period of the parliamentary calendar.

A debate arising, it was moved by Ms. Mowat:

That the motion be amended by deleting section 1 and replacing it with the following:

- "1(a) Subject to 1(b), all Members of the Legislative Assembly who are eligible to be fully vaccinated against COVID-19 must present a proof of vaccination to the Speaker to attend and participate in all forms of legislative proceedings;
- 1(b) Members of the Legislative Assembly with a bona fide medical exemption from COVID-19 vaccination verified by a physician licensed to practice medicine in Saskatchewan shall be permitted to participate in legislative proceedings after providing a copy of their physician's verification and daily proof of a negative COVID-19 test to the Speaker. Proof of a negative test must not be more than 72 hours old;" and,

That section 3 be amended by deleting the words "except when speaking during proceedings after being recognized by the Chair;" and further,

That section 4 be amended by deleting the words "except when required to participate in proceedings."
