QUESTIONS ORDERED FOR RETURN

The following written question was converted and an order for return was issued:

Return no. 17 (Ms. Wilson):

To the Minister of SaskBuilds and Procurement, re: SPS-RFP-0484 Individual Digital ID Solution and Service Offering, "This Request for Proposal (RFP) is an invitation by the Government of Saskatchewan (GOS) to prospective Proponents to submit proposals for the provision of the solutions and services encompassed in the Saskatchewan Individual Digital Identity Roadmap, as further described in the RFP Particulars (Appendix A). GOS is seeking a long-term partner to design, build, test, implement, roll out, and operate a level of assurance three (LOA3)2 digital identity, in collaboration with the GOS digital partner network;" (a) the partners in the GOS Digital Partner Network, (b) the individual information that is proposed to be attached to each Individual Digital ID, (c) what the Saskatchewan Individual Digital Identity Roadmap is and where the public can view it, (d) the form of consultation, if any, that the government used to obtain the consent of the Saskatchewan electorate to implement Individual Digital Identification, and (e) whether the SPS-RFP-0484 tender has been awarded to any company.
