QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS

The following responses to written questions were tabled by the government:

Question no. 32 (Ms. Wilson):

To the Minister of Health, the Sask Vaccination Wallet application is provided by the Quebec tech company Akinox as a white-labelled product, (a) was a middle entity providing service updates and at what price point, (b) what are the security protocols on these data centres, (c) is the data actually cloud-based storage, (d) what countries are hosting this service, and (e) what protocols are in place to prevent the extraction of individual data from the metadata?

Answer:

- (a) No.
- (b) N/A – there are no data centres.
- (c) N/A – information is stored locally/on the individual's device.
- (d) N/A – information is stored locally/on the individual's device.
- (e) N/A – since information is stored on the individual's device, no one else can access/extract data.

Question no. 33 (Ms. Wilson):

To the Minister of SaskBuilds and Procurement, the Sask Vaccination Wallet application is provided by the Quebec tech company Akinox; they supply the Saskatchewan government, (a) was this through procurement or was it sole-sourced, (b) what company did the cybersecurity audit, (c) was the audit independently initiated by the Saskatchewan government to ensure the privacy of the information as per the privacy policies, (d) what encryption protocols are being utilized for the direct interface between user and servers for the Sask Vaccine Wallet application, and (e) where is the data being stored?

Answer:

- (a) The Ministry of SaskBuilds and Procurement was not involved in the procurement of the Saskatchewan Vaccination Wallet application.
- (b) The Ministry of SaskBuilds and Procurement was not involved in the procurement of the Saskatchewan Vaccination Wallet Application and cannot comment on which company performed a cybersecurity audit.
- (c) The Ministry of SaskBuilds and Procurement was not involved in the procurement of the Saskatchewan Vaccination Wallet Application and cannot comment on the privacy information and policies that are associated with the application.
- (d) The Ministry of SaskBuilds and Procurement was not involved in the procurement of the Saskatchewan Vaccination Wallet Application and cannot comment on what encryption protocols are being utilized for the direct interface between the users and servers of the application.
- (e) The Ministry of SaskBuilds and Procurement was not involved in the procurement of the Saskatchewan Vaccination Wallet Application and cannot comment on the application's data storage practices.
