QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS

The following response to a written question was tabled by the government:

Question no. 92 (Ms. Wilson):

For the Minister of Agriculture, whereas the Saskatchewan Crop Insurance Corporation provides insurance for Saskatchewan grain producers, (a) which company is providing reinsurance for the program; (b) is there a reinsurance element linked to the federal matched funding, and (c) what group is responsible for the reinsurance?

Answer:

- (a) There are multiple companies that participate in SCIC's private reinsurance placement. Each company takes a portion of the total coverage SCIC is seeking to purchase.
- (b) There is no link or requirement from the federal government to purchase private reinsurance.
- (c) SCIC.
