Ms. Young (Lloydminster), Chair of the Standing Committee on the Economy, presented the committee's sixth report, which is as follows:

### REPORT OF THE STANDING COMMITTEE ON CROWN AND CENTRAL AGENCIES

Mr. Cheveldayoff, Chair of the Standing Committee on Crown and Central Agencies, presented the committee's eighth report, which is as follows:

### **Ministries and Agencies**

For SaskBuilds and Procurement	\$2,500,000
For SaskBuilds Corporation	\$30,400,000

On motion of Mr. Cheveldayoff:

Ordered, That the eighth report of the Standing Committee on Crown and Central Agencies be now concurred in.

### SEVENTY-FIVE MINUTE DEBATE

The order of the day being called for the following motion for a seventy-five minute debate, it was moved by Mr. Keisig:

That this Assembly calls upon the Government of Saskatchewan to continue with the broad efforts and years of government advocacy work which led to the Saskatchewan First Act which will stand up for and assert Saskatchewan's exclusive provincial jurisdiction over non-renewable natural resources and the operation of sites and facilities for electrical energy production and generation;

And further, that this Assembly condemns the Liberal/NDP federal government's proposed Clean Electricity Regulations, oil and gas cap, and Federal Fuel Standard as unconstitutional, uneconomical, and a clear violation of provincial rights.

A debate arising and the period of seventy-five minutes having expired, pursuant to rule 25(5) the Deputy Speaker interrupted proceedings.

### **PRIVATE MEMBERS' MOTIONS**

The Assembly resumed the adjourned debate on the proposed motion no. 2 moved by Mr. Wotherspoon:

That the Assembly calls upon the government to suspend the collection of the provincial fuel tax from gasoline and diesel for a period of six months in order to help families struggling with the high cost of living.

The debate continuing, it was on motion of Mr. Love adjourned.

On motion of the Hon. Mr. Harrison (Meadow Lake):

Ordered, That this Assembly do now adjourn.
