READING AND RECEIVING PETITIONS

According to order and pursuant to rule 16(7), petitions from residents of the province of Saskatchewan, requesting the following action, were read and received:

To immediately address the inadequate condition of Highway 9 by working with and listening to the concerns of municipalities, residents, and industry.

To protect the boreal forest and reject the proposed Lambert Peat Moss development.

To immediately reverse the Ministry of Education's *Use of Preferred First Name and Pronouns by Students* policy, and instruct the Ministry of Education to publicly consult with educators, parents, students, and subject matter experts to develop and implement 2SLGBTQIA+ affirming policy at all levels of the education system.

To provide adequate, sustainable, and predictable operating funds for Saskatchewan's 27 public and separate school divisions.
