3. Ms. Sproule, to ask the government the following Question No. 819:

To the Minister of the Economy: How many times has the Ministry of the Economy asked for an economic evaluation of gas conservation be done even when testing shows combined flaring and venting volumes do not exceed 900m<sup>3</sup>/day per site?

34. Ms. Sproule, to ask the government the following Question No. 850:

To the Minister of the Economy: What is the volume of associated gas that has been conserved due to Directive S-10 from July 1, 2012 to date?

35. Ms. Sproule, to ask the government the following Question No. 851:

To the Minister of the Economy: What is the economic value of the volume of associated gas that has been conserved due to Directive S-10 from July 1, 2012 to date?

36. Ms. Sproule, to ask the government the following Question No. 852:

To the Minister of the Economy: What is the volume of associated gas that has not been conserved due to Directive S-10 from July 1, 2012 to date?

37. Ms. Sproule, to ask the government the following Question No. 853:

To the Minister of the Economy: What is the economic value of the volume of associated gas that has not been conserved due to Directive S-10 from July 1, 2012 to date?

38. Ms. Sproule, to ask the government the following Question No. 854:

To the Minister of the Economy: How many oil wells and battery sites have flare volumes greater than 900m<sup>3</sup>/day per site and are within 500 metres of existing residences where, regardless of economics, they must conserve their associated gas?

39. Ms. Sproule, to ask the government the following Question No. 855:

To the Minister of the Economy: How many oil wells and battery sites have flare volumes greater than 900m<sup>3</sup>/day per site and are within 500 metres of existing residences where, regardless of economics, are exempted from conserving their associated gas due to consent being obtained from the residence?

To the Minister of the Economy: How many oil wells and battery sites with flare volumes greater than 900m<sup>3</sup>/day that meet the economic criteria have begun associated gas conservation?

To the Minister of the Economy: How many oil wells and battery sites with gas-to-oil ratios of greater than 3500m<sup>3</sup>/m<sup>3</sup> have been shut in for any period of time due to not having associated gas conservation systems in operation?
