## APPENDIX A

### WRITTEN QUESTIONS

**The following question was given notice on day no. 3 and is to be answered by day no. 8:**

**1. Question no. 1 (Ms. Wilson):**

To the Premier of Saskatchewan, Executive Council, Minister of Health, and Minister of Mental Health and Addictions, Seniors and Rural and Remote Health, since the roll-out of the COVID-19 inoculations in 2021, many Saskatchewan people have suffered vaccine injuries. Many of these citizens have contacted Members of the Legislative Assembly to communicate that they have experienced extreme obstacles in trying to report and navigate the provincial health system to have these injuries acknowledged and treated. Often, these patients report that their doctors are reluctant to report vaccine injuries due to fear of sanctions by the College of Physicians and Surgeons. Therefore, the actual number of vaccine injuries is severely underreported and the true number might never be known. Patients and doctors feel abandoned by the health care system and the government; (a) will the government create an impartial medical panel to conduct hearings to allow independent investigation to determine the nature of interferences in how/what doctors are allowed to report, (b) if yes, when, and how, and (c) if no, what will the government do to investigate and address the reported interferences in doctor-patient relationship which have prevented doctors from fulfilling their fiduciary duty to patients?
