#### **APPENDIX A**

## WRITTEN QUESTIONS

The following question was given notice on day no. 7 and is to be answered by day no. 12:

#### 1. Question no. 42 (Ms. Wilson):

To the Minister of Health and the Minister of Mental Health and Addictions, Seniors and Rural and Remote Health, since the roll-out of the COVID-19 inoculations in 2021, many Saskatchewan people have suffered vaccine injuries. Many of these citizens also report that they have experienced extreme obstacles in trying to report and navigate the provincial health system to have these injuries acknowledged and treated. Often, these patients report that their doctors are reluctant to report vaccine injuries due to fear of sanctions by the College of Physicians and Surgeons. Therefore, the actual number of vaccine injuries might never be known. Patients and doctors feel abandoned by the health care system and the government. Statistics from the Ministry of Health show over 1,200 adverse reactions in the first ten months alone. This breaks down to an adverse effect ratio of 7.5 reactions per 1,000 injections. Extrapolating that most had two injections during this period, this translates to a risk factor of 15 adverse reactions per 500 people or 3 per cent. The issue of 'informed consent' is also at issue. People attending clinics were told to expect a sore arm, or that they might feel sick for a few days. Few, if any at all, were advised about the potential to develop myocarditis, pericarditis, blood clots, Bells Palsy, Guillain-Barré Syndrome, stillbirths, menstrual issues and a host of other side effects. The vast majority of Saskatchewan people did not find out about these risks until well after they took, or were coerced into taking, the COVID-19 inoculations; (a) given these circumstances, what will the Government of Saskatchewan do, independent of the federal government, to investigate and compensate vaccine injured victims and their families, (b) will the government create an impartial medical panel to conduct hearings with independent investigation to determine whether there was interference in how and what doctors are/were allowed to report, and (c) what has or will the government do to ensure the public is fully informed about the efficacy/lack of efficacy, and the potential side effects of taking the experimental mRNA therapies?
