Mr. Speaker, as Chair of the Standing Committee on House Services, presents the Second Report of the said committee.

Your Committee is pleased to report that a Sub-Committee on Agenda and Procedure (Steering Committee), comprising of Mr. Speaker as Chair, together with Mr. Gantefoer (Opposition House Leader) and Mr. Van Mulligen (Government House Leader), was appointed to assist the Chair with the management the committee's business.

1. Introduction

At the opening of a new Legislature, the *Rules and Procedures of the Legislative Assembly of Saskatchewan* (the Rules) require the House Services Committee to set the membership of the various standing committees (Rule 124(2)) and to establish guidelines for the allotment of business to the four policy field standing committees (Rule 124(3)). This report completes the listing of committee membership (re: First Report of the Standing Committee on House Services) and provides a schedule for the allocation of government departments, agencies and Crown corporations to the policy field committees.

Your Committee also has responsibility under the Rules to oversee the operation, organization and facilities of legislative committees. This Second Report makes a number of recommendations in this regard.

2. Membership of Standing Committees

Your Committee's First Report made recommendations for the membership of all but two of the standing committees. Your Committee is now ready to finish the list of Members to serve on the various standing committees. Pursuant to Rule 124(2), your Committee recommends as the following membership:

3. Allocation of Business to Policy Field Committees

Your Committee has developed a schedule that allocates government departments, agencies, Crown corporations and statutes to the four policy field committees. The schedule is attached as the appendix of this report.

The allocations have been made using the general guidelines of subject areas for the policy field standing committees, as outlined by Rule 128. The schedule is intended as a guideline to be used when budgetary estimates are withdrawn from the Committee of Finance for referral to the policy field committees and for the committal of Bills after first or second reading.

Recommendation

That the Allocation Schedule for Policy Field Committees, as specified in the Appendix to the Second Report of the Standing Committee on House Services, be adopted as a guideline in accordance with Rule 124 (3) of the Rules and Procedures of the Legislative Assembly of Saskatchewan.

4. Guidelines for Use of Chamber during Meetings of Standing Committees

The 25th Legislature marks the beginning of a new committee system. An important feature of the new committee system is the ability of two committees to conduct business at the same time. One of recommendations of your Committee's predecessor, the *Special Committee on Rules and Procedures*, was the establishment of two committee rooms equipped for public hearings and capable of broadcasting committee hearings on television and the internet. Your Committee is very pleased to report that the Assembly's existing committee room has been developed into a first rate facility that meets the requirements of the new committees. In the absence of a second committee room, the Assembly has agreed that the Chamber, with its television broadcast facilities, may be used by standing committees for their proceedings. Your committee is aware that the use of the Chamber for committee meetings does present some difficulties.

One of the main challenges of using the Chamber as a committee room is its size and seating arrangement. As well, the Chamber does not have the facilities for modern multimedia presentations. For each committee meeting, the Chamber requires minor reconfiguration to accommodate witnesses and the public. Even with these shortcomings, your Committee recognizes the necessity for using the Chamber to host committee meetings. This report proposes a number of recommendations that your Committee hopes will maximize the advantages of the renovated committee room, and minimize the disadvantages of the Chamber.

Your Committee has determined that guidelines are required to govern the use of the Chamber for meetings of standing committees. The Chamber, of course, was not designed for the less formal atmosphere of the smaller standing committees. In a committee room setting, witnesses are accommodated at the committee table and observers are seated in close proximity. Movement around the room is not restricted. As well, in the committee room setting, caucus staff and advisors have access to their Members. The committee room setting is not easily replicated in the Chamber given its size and arrangement of individual Members' desks.

Your Committee has taken into consideration these limitations and the implications unrestricted access beyond the bar might have with respect to the security of Members' desks and papers. Your Committee has also considered the best method of distinguishing committee proceedings from House proceedings, especially for the television audience. The recommendation that follows strikes a balance between the less formal committee room setting and the traditional sanctity of the Legislative Chamber.

Recommendation

That guidelines for the use of the Legislative Chamber for meetings of standing committees be established as follows:

- 1. The Committee Chair and committee officers shall occupy the Chamber Table.
- 2. Members of the committee shall occupy the desks of the front row on both sides of the Chamber, and the seating arrangement will centre on the desk of the Premier on the government side, and the Leader of the Opposition on the opposition side of the House.
- 3. Other Members, staff and advisors may occupy desks immediately behind their Members.
- 4. A witness table, and one row of chairs behind the witness table, shall be situated at the north end of the Chamber, at the foot of main entrance steps.
- 5. Ministers shall testify from the witness table and their officials may be situated along side and behind the Minister.
- 6. The public may occupy chairs behind the bar along the north wall of the Chamber, on either side of the main entrance.
- 7. The media may occupy the Press Gallery during public proceedings of standing committees.
- 8. The public galleries, and Speaker's gallery, will remain open during public proceedings of standing committees.

The aforementioned are intended to serve as useful guidelines for committee operations and should in no way supersede the traditional responsibility of the Speaker with respect to the use of the Chamber.

5. Establishment of a Weekly House and Committee Calendar

The new committee system provides many new opportunities and advantages over the traditional method of conducting Assembly business. It has also complicated the management of that business. For instance, there are now six or more venues where estimates or bills could be considered. On any given day, Monday through Thursday, proceedings could be taking place simultaneously in two different locations. Much of the business of the new committees is also integrated with House processes, such as the reading stages of Bills.

It is your Committee's recommendation that a weekly calendar of House and committee proceedings is established to serve as a guideline for the use of the House Leaders in their scheduling of proceedings and by Committee Chairs in the scheduling of committee meetings, setting of business agendas, and arrangement for witnesses. A calendar will serve to provide a structure that will assist Members in organizing their own timetables, and for the Assembly to arrange its staffing.

Your Committee makes the following recommendation:

Recommendation

That a weekly calendar of Committee and House proceedings be established, and;

That the calendar shall serve as a non-binding guideline for the organization of proceedings during week day afternoons and;

That the framework of the calendar shall be as follows:

Monday	 House Proceedings 1:30 p.m. until adjournment (or recess) When work load of committees requires, House may adjourn at approximately 2:45 p.m. and committees may meet 3:00 - 5:00 p.m. and 7:00 - 10:30 p.m.
Tuesday	 House Proceedings 1:30 p.m. until adjournment (or recess) When work load of committees requires, House may adjourn at approximately 2:45 p.m. and committees may meet 3:00 - 5:00 p.m. and 7:00 - 10:30 p.m.
Wednesday	 House Proceedings 1:30 p.m. until approximately 2:45 p.m. Economy Committee 3 p.m. to 5 p.m. (meet in Room 8) Crown & Central Agencies Committee 3 p.m. to 5 p.m. (meet in the Chamber)
Thursday	 House Proceedings 1:30 p.m. until approximately 2:45 p.m. Human Services Committee 3 p.m. to 5 p.m. (meet in Room 8) Intergovernmental Affairs and Infrastructure Committee 3 p.m. to 5 p.m. (meet in Chamber)

6. Guidelines for Determining Meeting Location and Broadcast Priorities for Committees

Although two committees may meet simultaneously, only the proceedings of one can be broadcast live on television. Your Committee has determined that guidelines are necessary to establish what committee proceedings will be broadcast live on television and what committee proceedings will be broadcast on a taped delay basis.

Another issue that requires advance planning is where public hearings should be conducted. Your Committee has pointed out that only the committee room is properly suited to public hearings. For this reason, it is your Committee's conclusion that public hearings should be planned to take place in the committee room.

With respect to these two matters, your Committee recommends the following.

Recommendation

That committee proceedings conducted in the Committee Room be live television broadcast and that the committee proceedings conducted in the Chamber be broadcast on a taped delay basis, and further;

That standing committees perform public hearings in the Committee Room rather than the Chamber.

7. Conclusion

It is your Committee's hope that these recommendations, if adopted by the Assembly, will streamline the House and Committee reforms about to be put into use for the first time. It is your Committee's intention to monitor the implementation of the new rules and to make recommendations if adjustments are required.
