That following section 2 of Bill 109 – The Criminal Enterprise Suppression Act the following new clause be added:

### **Court's considerations**

- 2.1 For the purpose of any order issued by a court pursuant to this Act, the court shall take the following considerations into account:
  - (a) the seriousness of the degree of injury to the public that would result if no order is issued;
  - (b) the seriousness of the unlawful activity that is occurring or that may occur and its overall impact on public safety;

- (c) the degree-level of impairment or intrusion into an individual's civil right;
- (d) whether or not the order will bring the administration of justice into disrepute;
- (e) any other consideration that the court considers in the circumstances whether or not the issue is raised by the parties to the application.

A debate arising and the question being put, the motion was defeated.
