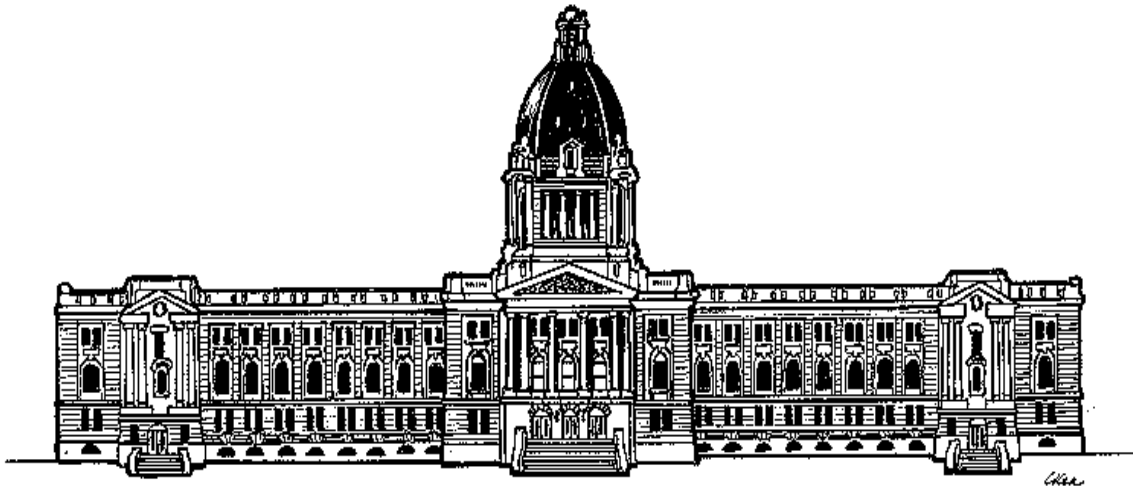

[The committee met at 09:00.]

The Chair: — Well good morning and welcome to the Standing Committee on Intergovernmental Affairs and Justice. I am Warren Michelson. I am the Chair of the committee. Other members of the chair would include Cathy Sproule, the Deputy Chair; Kevin Phillips; Warren Steinley; Lyle Stewart; Christine Tell; and Corey Tochor.

This morning the business before the committee is Bill No. 36, *The Constituency Boundaries Amendment Act, 2011* and Bill No. 37, *The Tourism Saskatchewan Act*.

We will begin with Bill No. 36, *The Constituency Boundaries Amendment Act, 2011*.

Bill No. 36 — *The Constituency Boundaries Amendment Act, 2011*

The Chair: — The business before the committee is Bill No. 36, *The Constituency Boundaries Amendment Act, 2011*. The Bill will now be considered in accordance with rule 34(2) and rule 35(a), which reads as follows.

Rule 34(2):

In any case where a specified bill has not been reported by a standing committee before 9:00 a.m. on the day prior to the Completion Day, the committee shall convene to conclude examination of the bill as follows:

(a) The Chair will put the question on any amendments, new clauses or new schedules that had been previously proposed before putting a combined question, if required, in order to conclude examination of the bill.

Rule 35(a):

Each specified bill introduced during the fall period of sittings or before December 21st during the first session of a new Legislature is subject to no less than 20 hours of debate.

These conditions have been met. Bill No. 36, *The Constituency Boundaries Amendment Act, 2011*, has just over 20 hours of debate. The committee will now proceed to the combined question on all clauses of the Bill.

Are the clauses 1 through 8 agreed?

Some Hon. Members: — Agreed.

The Chair: — Ms. Sproule.

Ms. Sproule: — Could I request that this vote be recorded please?

The Chair: — You may. Ms. Sproule has asked for a recorded vote. I ask members to vote by a show of hands. Those in favour? Those opposed? The motion is carried by six in favour and one opposed. The motion is carried.

[Clauses 1 to 8 inclusive agreed to.]

The Chair: — Her Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Assembly of Saskatchewan, enacts the following: *The Constituency Boundaries Amendment Act, 2011*. The examination of Bill No. 36 is now complete. I will now entertain a motion to report the Bill without amendment. I recognize Ms. Tell.

Ms. Tell has moved that Bill No. 36, *The Constituency Boundaries Amendment Act, 2011* be reported without amendment. Is it the pleasure of the committee to adopt the motion?

Some Hon. Members: — Agreed.

The Chair: — Carried. The next item of business before the committee is Bill No. 37, *The Tourism Saskatchewan Act*.

Bill No. 37 — *The Tourism Saskatchewan Act*

The Chair: — The Bill has now been considered in accordance with rule 34(2), which has been previously read and rule 35(b), which reads as follows:

Each specified bill subsidiary to the passage of the budget Estimates is subject to no less than five hours of debate.

These conditions have been met. Bill No. 37, *The Tourism Saskatchewan Act*, has just over 5 hours of debate. The committee will now proceed to the combined question on all clauses of the Bill.

Are clauses 1 through 30 agreed? Ms. Sproule.

Ms. Sproule: — Could I ask that this Bill be recorded as well?

The Chair: — Ms. Sproule has asked for a recorded vote. I ask members again to vote with their hands. Those in favour? Those opposed? The motion is carried, six in favour and one opposed. The motion is carried.

[Clauses 1 to 30 inclusive agreed to.]

The Chair: — Her Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Assembly of Saskatchewan enacts the following: *The Tourism Saskatchewan Act*. The examination of Bill No. 37 is now complete. I will now entertain a motion to report the Bill without amendment. I recognize Mr. Tochor.

Mr. Tochor has moved that Bill No. 37, *The Tourism Saskatchewan Act* be reported without amendment. Is it the pleasure of the committee to adopt the motion?

Some Hon. Members: — Agreed.

The Chair: — Carried. In accordance with rule 34, this committee now stands adjourned.
