The Canadian Revival Training Centre Act, 2018

REPORT OF THE LAW CLERK AND PARLIAMENTARY COUNSEL

to the

Standing Committee on Private Bills

I have examined this Private Bill and am pleased to report that it is drawn in accordance with the Rules of the Legislative Assembly respecting Private Bills.

I have reviewed the Private Bill and have had a number of meetings regarding the Private Bill on a variety of topics with individuals from the CRTC and the Ministry of Advanced Education.

As a result of these meetings and research, it came to my attention that the CRTC had been struck from the corporate registry on one occasion. It was re-instated the following year. I do not know why it was struck from the registry for one year and I did not make any inquiries as to why that occurred. However, it is incumbent upon me to bring this information to the Committee's attention.

One provision that I would like to bring to the attention of the Committee members is section 3.

I have no concern with the present wording of section 3. Subsection (1) continues that the CRTC is a corporate entity under the Private Act. This is a standard provision that is usually included in a Private Bill of this nature.

Subsection 3(2) is the new standard provision with respect to Degree granting status for colleges in Saskatchewan established by the Private Act.

In closing I would only add that all entities in the Province of Saskatchewan, regardless of their legal status or how they are incorporated, must comply with the provisions of all provincial statutes.
