Speed Limits

- Proper speed limits are:
 - Set on the basis of an engineering study
 - Safe
 - Enforceable
 - Obeyed by the majority of drivers
 - Consistent with travel speeds and therefore do not create a false sense of security
 - Respected by the public
 - Close to prevailing speeds



Speed Limits

- Speed limit changes are initiated by:
 - Public complaint
 - RM request
 - Road upgrade or modification
 - Recent collision record
 - Internal assessment



Intersection Changes

- Intersection changes include:
 - Sightline Improvements
 - Sight Distances
 - Driver Alerts - Flashing Amber Beacons/Noise Bars
 - Important Intersection Signing
 - Intersection Area Lighting
 - Introduction of Turning Lanes etc.
 - Interchanges
